First Reading Jer 17:5-8

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The Lord says this:

'A curse on the man who puts his trust in man, who relies on things of flesh, whose heart turns from the Lord. He is like dry scrub in the wastelands: if good comes, he has no eyes for it, he settles in the parched places of the wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited.

'A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord for his hope.

He is like a tree by the waterside that thrusts its roots to the stream: when the heat comes it feels no alarm, its foliage stays green; it has no worries in a year of drought, and never ceases to bear fruit.'

Message from our Parish Priest, Fr Michael Parish's Bank Loan is Discharged

On behalf of the Parish, I wish to thank you for the many donations you have given over the last ten years, especially the generous donations made for the Church Building Fund, as the Parish's bank loan has finally been discharged. The bank loan was taken out ten years ago to pay for the extension of the church, more than doubling its size.

In addition to being free of debt, the Parish is receiving rent from St Vincent's Care Services which are now operating Rosary Village. Consequently, we can now shift our focus to the much needed pastoral outreach by which we can help the people of Fairfield be renewed in their relationship with God and thus build up our faith-community. This shift in focus will be according to what was identified at the General Assemblies held on 9 January 2016 and 20 May 2017. In addition to your much valued contributions, such outreach requires the assistance of additional staff which the Parish was not able to employ until now.

Additional staff is needed for another reason. The Archbishop of Sydney has appointment me to undertake a number of duties outside the Parish. Firstly, I have been appointed as the Acting Dean of the South West Deanery (a deanery is a cluster of parishes). This role requires me to provide pastoral care and support for the priests in the parishes in the South West region of Sydney and to provide regular updates to the Archbishop regarding what needs are being faced in those parishes so that they can receive the support and resource they need. In addition to Fairfield, these parishes are: Cabramatta, Smithfield, Villawood/ Sefton, Georges Hall, Holsworthy, Moorebank, Padstow, Revesby, and Panania/Revesby Heights.

Secondly, I have been appointed as an Adjunct Spiritual Director for the Seminary of the Good Shepherd, Homebush. There are now 55 seminarians, including the deacons in formation, studying for the Priesthood. When I was in the seminary, I was only one of 19 seminarians when the numbers dropped to an all-time low in 1995. Now that the number of seminarians has tripled, the Seminary needs the assistance of additional priests to help provide priestly formation. Next Sunday, I will publish some information in the Parish Bulletin about the two additional staff members

who will be working on an executive level in the Parish Office and what services they will provide to for the good of our faith-community.


All members of this ministry are asked to attend this important training including those who have already done this training. Copy of your baptism certificate have to be attached with the form.
