PENTECOST SUNDAY YEAR C 09 June, 2019:

First Reading Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.



When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medesand Elamites; people from Mesopotamia,

Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia Egypt and the part of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome, Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God

Responsorial Psalm Ps 103:1. 24. 29-31. 34. R. v.30

(R.) Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading Rom 8:8-17

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans *Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God.*

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you. So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live. Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Planned Giving Programme

The Planned Giving Program is a means by which parishioners can plan in advance the way they contribute towards the Church Building Fund. If you have registered for the Planned Giving Program, the new en-



velopes for the 2019-2020 financial year will be ready in the next two weeks and tax receipts for 1 July 2018 – 1 July 2019 will be ready upon request. Please inform Parish Office if you would like a copy.

If you have not registered for the Planned Giving Program, I invite you on behalf of OLR Parish to register by virtue of the following benefits:

- 1. The Planned Giving Program assists the Parish to undertake repairs and maintenance and any refurbishments in respond to pastoral needs. Currently, the Parish is in the process of refurbishing the Children's Liturgy Room and the Youth Room with a new floor, cupboards, an audiovisual system, tables and chairs. The Parish Meeting Room will also be refurbished with a new floor and cupboards. Additionally, the Confessional will be refurbished in response to the Archbishop's decree which requires a separate door for penitents to the door the priest opens to enter the Confessional; and
- 2. The envelopes received for every Sunday enables you to plan what you give in advance. Additionally, by placing your donations on the collection plate in these envelopes affords you the opportunity to offer an amount in privacy; and
- 3. In the 2019-2020 financial year, the tax deductibility will increase from 25% to 30%. To obtain this benefit, the new Registration Form for the Planned Giving Program (which is included in each new box of envelopes) needs to be filled in and returned to the Parish Office either in person, by mail, or as a scanned attachment in an email to: admin@olrfairfield.org.au


