First Reading Ex 17:8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Message from the Parish Priest:

Below is a message from Rosalia which I invite you all to read. You would do well to pray for her and the family given the misfortune of their current circumstance. If you have any questions after you have read the letter, you may approach any of the Priests, Sandra Skarsky (Chairperson of the Parish Pastoral Council) or Ted Malicki (Chairperson of the Parish Finance Committee).

Letter from Rosalia Nauge

Unfortunately, I have had to resign in short notice from the position of Parish Assistant. My husband has been working in Australia on a 457 Visa. Consequently, I have been able to work in Australia, too. Rather than renew his Visa, my husband got a Bridging Visa because the company he works for applied for Permanent Residency (PR) on his behalf. According to the legal advice we received, we were confident of receiving PR because my husband works for a company in Fiji which requires him to travel back and forth to Australia on a regular basis. However, the application for PR was unsuccessful. As the Bridging Visa expires on 18 October 2019, my husband and I, together with our children, have had to return to Fiji in order to follow the Immigration Law. We plan to re-apply for PR. If this subsequent application is successful, I look forward to return to be among you to serve your needs. I understand that a Parish Secretary will be employed in the meantime. Please keep me and my family in your prayers so that we can return to Australia.

As a result of Rosalia's resignation, the Parish is now in need to employ a Parish Secretary. Below is the Job Description of this vacant position.

The primary purpose of this full-time position (37.5 hours per week) is to: provide a range of office support services to ensure the smooth and effective operation of the Parish Office; set up the church for services when required; and contribute cooperatively and collaboratively with the OLR Parish Office team and visiting clergy. The most desirable applicant will have: tertiary qualifications in an area that is relevant to this role; and demonstrated experience in administrative assistance and communications. At least intermediate experience is required with Microsoft Office Suite (i.e., Outlook, File Explorer, Internet Explorer, Word, Excel, Publisher, PowerPoint). Permanent full-time salary negotiable. On the job training will be provided. Applications are only open for people who already have the required Visa to work in Australia.

Weston Street Developments:

On Thursday 31 October 2019, a hearing for the Land and Environment Court will commence at 9:30 am on 7-11 Weston Street, Fairfield. The Commissioner who is hearing the proceedings will undertake an inspection of the site and the local area, and take evidence from individuals who wish to make a submission in relation to the Development Application (DA) a 6-storey residential flat building on this site which is a dead-end street near a kiss-and-drop zone for the many children who attend the Parish's Primary School and Outside School Hours Care (OSHC).

The attendance of as many parishioners and parents of the Primary School and OSHC as possible is needed to impress upon the Court that if the DA is approved, the safety of children will be at stake. Additionally, Weston Street will become even more congested making it difficult for parishioners to come to Mass. So that the hearing does not coincide with Mass, Mass on this day will take place at 8:00 am on this day which will be followed by a hot dog breakfast at 8:30am. Please spread the word about this community event in order to protect our children.
