Message from the Parish Priest

Relics of St Thérèse of Lisieux and Her Parents

The National Pilgrimage of the Relics of Saints Thérèse, and her parents, Louis and Zélie, will visit the Archdiocese of Sydney in February and March. Saint Thérèse is one of the Catholic Church's most popular Saints. An additional marvel is that her parents who helped nurture her faith are also Saints! A relic is the bodily remains of a Saint. We honour and venerate relics because the Saints lead us to God whom we worship in spirit and truth. By honouring their memories, bodies, and belongings, we give thanks to God for the saints' holy witness. Relics are physical, tangible, concrete reminders that heaven is obtainable for us.

One of the earliest sources that reveals how God's grace can be mediated through the use of relics is found in the Old Testament in relation to the prophet Elisha: "Elisha died and was buried. Now Moabite raiders used to enter the country every spring. Once while some Israelites were burying a man, suddenly they saw a band of raiders; so they threw the man's body into Elisha's tomb. When the body touched Elisha's bones, the man came to life and stood up on his feet" (2 Kings 13:20-21). In the Gospel accounts, the bleeding woman was healed when she touched the hem of Jesus' garment (Mark 28-29), and again, the people in Mark 6:56 who touched Jesus' garment were also healed (Mark 6:56). Further early sources of the veneration of relics are found in the Church's early history. The bodily remains of St Polycarp (who was a disciple of St John the Apostle who became ordained as a bishop by him) are recorded to have been venerated in the Martyrdom of Polycarp (written 150–160 AD).

With regard to relics that are objects (not persons), a passage that is often cited is Acts 19:11–12 which states that St Paul's handkerchiefs were imbued by God with healing power.

These relics Saints Thérèse, Louis and Zélie will be in Our Lady of the Rosary Parish on Friday 13 March 2020 from 3:00 to 9:00 pm. Next Sunday, you will find in the Parish Bulletin the schedule by which these relics will be venerated in our Parish.

If you want to venerate these relics in the other places they will be taken to throughout Sydney, the full itinerary (including details about where and when) is on the Parish Noticeboard.

A Message from Archbishop Fisher OP

Friends, the sad tragedy of the bushfires has impacted upon our Catholic community across the Archdiocese of Sydney in a very real way. A brave Rural Fire Service volunteer Andrew O'Dwyer was farewelled at a Requiem Mass this month at Our Lady of Victories Parish in Horsley Park. The parish is providing ongoing support to his widow Melissa and 19 month old daughter Charlotte and our prayers are with them. Amidst the devastation of the fires, it has been encouraging to witness the support of so many ordinary Australians, including so many men and women of faith. While much of the response must be at a local parish and diocesan level, such a great crisis also requires a national response. Alongside my brother Bishops across the country, I encourage you to donate to a special parish collection at Masses over the Australia Day weekend (25 and 26 January) through the St Vincent De Paul Society. Through this bushfire appeal, you can make a tangible difference in the lives of those affected, whether that be to cover basic clothing or the food bill for a family evacuated from their home. The support may also come through psychological counselling services for families left traumatised by the disaster or financial counselling as they struggle to pay unexpected bills. Together we can offer real comfort and long term support to families left struggling after the bushfires.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney Safeguarding Online Training Registration page will be displayed. On it you will be asked to provide some details like name, email address, parish in which you work in, and your position/volunteering work you do in the parish in order to access the induction training. After completing the online registration form, you will receive a message to your nominated email address containing your username, password and a link that will take you directly to the training. (Note: the email/message may arrive quickly or may take some time to arrive depending on the number of registration requests the Safeguarding office received).

At the end of the induction training session, a 'Safeguarding and Child Protection Induction Training Certificate' will be *generated* indicating that you have successfully completed the training.
