Message from the Parish Priest

More Catechists Needed

Catechist comes from the Greek word meaning "instruction by word of mouth." Catechists are lay volunteers who teach Scripture classes in public schools. Without our catechists, many children would not have the opportunity to learn about the Catholic Faith and how to pray in response to the love God has for them as revealed in Sacred Scripture. The many refugees who are moving into our area are increasing the size and number of catechist classes in 2 of the 5 public primary schools in our Parish, that is, Fairvale Public Primary School and Fairfield Public Primary School (the largest of these schools). The children love attending these classes and the interactive books they are given to help them learn about the Catholic Faith, but we no longer have enough catechists to teach them all.

Due to this growing need, I urge you to prayerfully consider becoming a catechist or encourage some people you know to become one. To become a catechist, training is provided on five Mondays starting on 10 February from 9:45 am to 2:15 pm at Moorebank Parish which is conveniently located, as it is one of our neighbouring parishes. If attendance at the first class is not possible in short notice, please register with the Parish Office nonetheless. For if enough people register, arrangements will be made for another training session to be provided in our own Parish at a day and time that best suits those who register.

If you or a person you know do not want to become a catechist, but are willing to be a helper of a catechist, only attending the first three of the five training sessions is required. Vincent Haber from the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) will be speaking at the 9:00 am and 10:30 am Masses this weekend to further address the needs of the Catholic children in our public schools. You are welcome to speak with Heather and other catechists after these Masses, to discuss this further.

A Message from the Archbishop's Office re Coronavirus

A number of priests and parishioners have inquired about precautions in relation to the current health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus. At this point, health authorities have said that the risk of exposure to the public is low, especially if they have not travelled to one of the affected areas, nor had contact with someone who has. We will continue to monitor the Government's health advice.

Across the Church in Australia generally, and in the Archdiocese of Sydney in particular, there are as yet no mandated precautions beyond the common sense rule that people should stay home if they think they might be sick or infectious. Ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands with soap or hand wash before distributing the Body of Christ.

Parishioners who wish further to minimise the risk of transmission are free not to put their fingers in the holy water stoop, not to shake hands at the Sign of Peace, not to receive Holy Communion on the tongue (but only in the hand), and/or not to receive Holy Communion from the chalice. We pray for all those affected by this virus and for those grieving or caring for them.


