## **Charitable Works Fund Appeal**

On behalf of the Parish, I thank the students of Our Lady of the Rosary Primary School for raising \$700 for the Charitable Works Fund (CWF) appeal which they participated in before Christmas last year. Their contributions demonstrate their commitment to help the charitable agencies in the Archdiocese of Sydney give witness to the love of God through their works of charitable service. These agencies are CatholicCare which provides social welfare services to individuals and families; hospital and university chaplaincies; the Ephpheta Centre which ministers to the hearing impaired; the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine which provides resources for religious education in State schools; the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry; and the Seminary of the Good Shepherd, Homebush which provides priestly formation for men preparing for the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Last Sunday, the CWF appeal took place in our church. Next Sunday, the total amount donated for this appeal will be published in the Parish Bulletin.

## Excerpt from the Archbishop's Message on Lenten Penance

(Please see a copy of the full message at the back of the Church)

In this season of Lent, we seek to experience the mercy of God the Father, and to practice it in our daily lives. But first we must experience our need for mercy, that is, our brokenness and, indeed, our sinfulness, insofar as we have failed to love God above all, and to love our fellow men and women as ourselves. This is why the Church's Canon Law reaffirms the obligation to do penance - to interrupt the usual comforts of life, to rediscover in prayer the merciful love of God, and to practice charity and justice towards those in need. The special times of penance are all Fridays throughout the year and the season of Lent.

## **Days of Penance**

Abstinence from meat, and fasting, must be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast (on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday). All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain.

On all other Fridays of the year including the Fridays of Lent, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

**prayer** - for example, Mass attendance; a visit to a church **self-denial** - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; limiting use of social media, smart phones or television.

**helping others** - for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.

Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday (26th Feb) to the Mass of the Lord's Supper (9th April). On Good Friday and, if possible, also on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter Fast is observed.

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Co1mmmion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday, 26th February, and Trinity Sunday, 7th June, 2020 unless for a good reason it is done at another time during the year. All the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.

#### Kid's Corner

The Children's Liturgy Of The Word has resumed. The Children's Liturgy operates during the Sunday 9:00am Mass, twice a month, for school aged children 5 to 12yrs old.

The children are led by the Children's Liturgy Ministers to the Children's Liturgy Room (a room close to the church), after the opening prayers. The Gospel is proclaimed to them at their own level of understanding. They are led through prayers, songs and readings. Then the Ministers lead them back to the church where they participate in the offertory procession and then return to their family.
