

# Fourth Sunday of Easter - Year A (03 May, 2020)

#### Entrance Antiphon Cf. Ps 32:5-6

The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

#### First Reading Acts 2:14. 36-41

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.' Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

#### A reading from the first letter of St Peter

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

#### **Gospel** Jn 10:1-10

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the

gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'

#### **Message from the Parish Priest**

#### **COVID-19 Discussion Between the Bishops and Parliamentarians**

The Archbishop has written to the Premier of NSW to request that churches could be opened for private prayer and for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All the bishops in NSW have expressed the same request. Archbishop anticipates the return to regular worship will take place in four stages:

Stage 1: opening the churches for private prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation followed by sanitisation of the pews and door handles; Stage 2: outdoor Masses with social distancing and

sanitising;

Stage 3: indoor Masses with a limited number of people who can assemble with social distancing and sanitising:

Stage 4: no restrictions for church assemblies, but hand-sanitizing requirements will accord with our times.

Moving from Stage 1 to Stage 4 could take anywhere from months to years, depending on how quickly the transmissions of COVID-19 completely cease.

Currently, most hospitals are restricting priests from administering the sacraments only to patients who are dying.

#### **Recent Deaths of 3 Priests in Sydney**

Three priests have died in the past three weeks; namely: Fr Ray Farrell, Fr Patrick MacAuliff, and Fr Peter Morrissey.

Fr Ray Farrell died on 27 March at the age of 73 years. He was ordained to the priesthood at St Felix De Valois Parish, Bankstown on 13 September 1996. His most recent appointment commenced as the Administrator of Auburn Parish in 2002 and then Parish Priest the following year. He remained as Parish Priest of Auburn Parish until his death. During his time as Parish Priest of Auburn, Fr Ray served as Dean of the Auburn Bankstown Deanery from 2003 until 2016. Fr Ray was also the current Chaplain to the Catholic Women's League, a role he commenced in 2003, and the current Chaplain of the Archdiocesan Council of St Vincent de Paul, a role he commenced in 2011. He served on the Council of Priests from 1997 until 2019.

Fr Patrick MacAuliff was the Parish Priest of Cabramatta. The Archbishop and I prayed at Fr Patrick's bedside on Friday 24 April along with his sisters. He died later that same day at 10 pm at the age of 89 years. He was ordained on 21 July 1956 at St Mary's Cathedral by Cardinal Gilroy. He served as an Assistant Priest at Surry Hills, Eastwood, (1962), Pagewood (1965), Lane Cove (1967) and Kingsgrove (1972). In 1974, Fr Pat was appointed Parish Priest of Sacred Heart Parish, Cabramatta and he remained there until his retirement in 2016.

He became a legendary figure in Cabramatta during the years in which it became the vibrant centre of Vietnamese life in Sydney. Even in retirement, he continued to visit schools and to provide supplies in his old parish.

#### **Message from the Parish Priest (Continued)**

Fr Peter Morrissey entered eternal life on 28 April at the age of 91 years. Fr Peter was ordained on 30 July 1955 at St Mary's Cathedral by His Eminence, Cardinal Gilroy. His most recent appointment before his retirement in 2003 was Parish Priest of St Patrick's Mortlake in 1997. Fr Peter was one of the first 'media priests' in Sydney. He had his own free-to-air afternoon TV show in the late 1960's - early 1970s. This was a children's 'catechetical' programme, in which he deployed his artistic skills to illustrate Gospel parables. His insightful, quirky and witty homilies were a drawcard wherever he ministered, and he was a much sought after homilist at the funerals of brother priests!

I invite you to pray for these priests who served the faithful so well. May they rest in peace and may the Lord himself be their reward.

#### 11th Anniversary of the Re-Consecration of Our Lady of the Rosary, Fairfield Church

This year, on 1 May, we are 1924 celebrating the 11<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our church's dedication. The church was dedicated to God in 1924 when it was first built, and was re-consecrated after the church was extended between 1946 - 1955, more than doubling its original size. As you are aware, churches are closed as part of the restrictions during the current pandemic. Compared to the difficulties **2019** we are facing with self isolation, the followers of Jesus in the early Church had bigger problems, as they were persecuted for their faith. In some places, they gathered over tombs of martyrs or secretly within homes to celebrate the Eucharist in response to Jesus' command at the Last Supper: (1 May 2009-1 May 2020) "Do this in memory of me" (Luke 22:19). However, in places where Christians were relatively secure, they gathered in larger church buildings.



The first recorded church dedication was in 314 in the city of Tyre, one year after the Emperor Constantine stopped the persecution of Christians. Although the church is made of physical stones, through the Sacrament of Baptism, we become "living stones," as St Peter said, "being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood." St Peter is referring here not only to ministerial priests, but the priesthood of the baptised known as the Royal Priesthood. Whenever we gather in the church to participate in the Eucharist, we are, as St Peter said, "offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 2:5). Indeed, many Catholics are currently gathering in their homes to pray, but the fulness of worship cannot take place unless we are present at Mass so that we can participate in the Eucharistic Sacrifice. Knowing this, today's Anniversary of the Dedication of our church provides us with an opportunity to renew our desire to commence assembling in the church once the transmission of COVID-19 ceases.
