IMPORTANT NOTICE

Gradual Return to Public Masses

Upon consulting the members of the Parish Pastoral Council, the church will open for public Masses gradually to ensure that the church can be closed for a full day in between each Mass until Fairfield is no longer in a hotspot so that:

- 1. a sufficient number of volunteers can sanitise the church; and
- 2. the chance of someone contracting the Coronavirus upon entering the church for each subsequent Mass can be reduced due to the likelihood of the virus no longer being viable by then.

Having stated this, the next Mass will be celebrated at 6 pm on Saturday which will be the Vigil Mass for Sunday. This Mass will be followed by Sunday Mass at 6 pm.

Parishioners will need to register beforehand either online or over the phone as required by NSW Health. If you want to register upon arrival, you would do well to arrive early. Please note that the Archbishop has asked his priests to encourage their parishioners **NOT to go from one Parish to another** for religious gatherings in order to restrict the spread of COVID-19.

<u>Message from the Parish Priest</u>

Sacrament of Confirmation is Postponed to 2021

The Archbishop instructed in his most recent pastoral letter regarding the Sacrament of Confirmation: "Inevitably, the number of guests for the celebrations this year and next will have to be somewhat restricted and we ask for people's understanding in this matter." Despite planning to multiply the Confirmation Masses. these restrictions would consist of only allowing the candidate, the sponsor, and two parents attending each Confirmation Mass. I was prepared to make arrangements in launching the Confirmation Sacramental Program this month, but now that the Parish currently has fewer staff, we will need to wait until next year until there is a sufficient amount of administrative assistance to help organise the complex requirements during the pandemic.

Having stated this, if you have a child who is currently in Year 6, I recommend that you contact the Parish Office to ask for an *Expression of Interest* Form to be sent to you. This form will enable your child to express his or her interest in participating in the Confirmation Sacramental Program next year. This expression of interest is needed because as your child will be in High School next year, the Parish will no longer have any direct contact with him or her as it currently does either through the teachers in Catholic primary schools.

Holy Land Collection Sunday 13 September

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land normally takes place on Good Friday. This year,

due to the closure of churches around the world during Holy Week because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, Pope Francis moved the date for this collection to Sunday 13 September to coincide with the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on 14 September. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools. orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from this collection. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Last year, Australian Catholics donated \$1.3 million to this cause, despite tough economic times, rural droughts and the increasing cost of living. This year, we are again facing great challenges due to COVID-19, but your generosity would again be greatly appreciated. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Sunday 13 September and please also keep them in your prayers. Thank you.

COVID 19 UPDATE


Parishioners are exhorted to wear face masks as a safeguard to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Congregational singing, the sign of peace and passing of the collection plate continue to be suspended at this time.

Church attendance numbers are limited to a maximum of 100 people, providing there is a four square metre space around each person, with the exception of people from the same household.

All parishes must ensure that their churches are not left unattended when their doors are open and must keep written record with names and contact details of everyone wo comes into the church at any time and these records must be kept for at least 4 weeks.

Parishes are advised to designate specific people to monitor the sign-in process and to make sure all people attending Masses are registering (at least one person from each family group).

Parishioners must not mingle before, during or after Mass since social distancing rules cannot be easily observed.
