# - Year B (3 January, 2021)

Entrance Antiphon Cf. Mal 3:1; 1 Chr 29:12 Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion.

#### First Reading

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples.

Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness.

Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and your daughters being tenderly carried.

At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow to you; the wealth of the nations come to you;

camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord.

#### Second Reading Eph 3:2-3. 5-6

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Christ Jesus, through the gospel.

### Gospel

Mt 2:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

#### Message from Fr. Bob Bossini

Dear Friends,

After much anticipation and waiting we come to the end of the liturgical season of Christmas with the celebration today of the Solemnity of the **Epiphany of the Lord**. In other parts of the world, the Epiphany is a celebrated with greater joy than Christmas. In these countries, presents are exchanged on the Epiphany rather than Christmas, linking up with the gifts brought to the Christ-Child by the Magi and the celebration of the manifestation to the world of His birth.

When we consider the readings for this celebration there is more of a feeling of beginning rather than completion. **Isaiah** in the first reading **[60:1-6]** speaks of the beginning of a **new dawn** with the appearance of a **light** which not only brings glory to Jerusalem but also allows people to be attracted by it.

**Paul** in his letter to the **Ephesians** speaks of a **great mystery** which was revealed to him, but which is now **made known to all people**: Jews and gentile alike. In fact, Paul states that all people make up the parts of the same body, because the same promise has been given to all people in Christ Jesus **[Ephesians 3:6]**.

Then we come to that very familiar scene described in today's Gospel [Matthew 2:1-12] of the visit of the Wise Men from the east to Bethlehem. In following the star they eventually find the Child, pay homage to him and depart for their homeland differently, since they have encountered the Light! They not only go back a different way, but they are different, since no one can really encounter Christ without being changed and challenged in their lives!

Epiphany calls to mind that the **Christ-Child belongs to all people** and not just to a select few. It challenges us to ensure that we play our part in **revealing this great mystery** to all by word and deed. The presence of **Herod** in the story reminds us of the **ever present dangers** within our world that are trying hard **to diminish and even extinguish the light of Christ**. As members of the Body that makes up Christ's Church, we need to ensure that our lives radiate the light of Christ. May our encounter with the Christ-Child this Christmas give us the strength and energy to be the presence of Christ to others.
