A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

#### **Gospel** Mk 1:21-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark *This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.* 

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

#### Message from Fr. Bob Bossini

Dear Friends,

When we think of the term 'prophet', what often comes to mind is the image of the person standing on a street corner vested in a sandwich board which bears the ominous message: 'The end is near!' This image portrays one aspect of the vocation of the prophet — to in some way 'predict' or 'foretell' a future event. The Bible presents us with another image of the prophet. It speaks of the prophet not so much as the predictor of future events, but as the person who clearly and passionately puts before the people an issue concerning their present situation.

One has only to think of the prophet Jonah, who was presented to us in last week's liturgy. Here is a person who receives the message and mandate from God to go to the people of Nineveh and tell them that they are not living a life in accordance with God's ways. The message goes on further as it pronounces a dire future for them if they do not repent of their ways [Jonah 3:1-5.10].

Therefore, from the Old Testament perspective, a prophet can be seen as having a distinctive role to play. Firstly, and most importantly, the prophet speaks not in his own voice, but in God's name. The prophet receives his authority from God. Secondly, the prophet needs to place his faith and trust in the message and meaning of the word that God delivers to him. He needs to be faithful to the requirements and demands of that message. The prophet needs to be reliant on God for direction, courage, and therefore to be committed to the religious community he has been asked to serve on God's behalf. When we consider the ministry of Moses among the Chosen People, we gain an idea of the fidelity required of a prophet.

In today's Gospel [Mark 1:21-28] we see in the life and ministry of Jesus the authenticity of a true prophet. Here he commands authority — an authority that comes from God — as he heals the demoniac on the Sabbath. We are told just prior to this that 'his teaching made a deep impression on them, because unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority' [Mark 1: 21].

Jesus indeed has the authority of his God to preach and minister in his name. He truly speaks in God's name. He is named and proclaimed by the demoniac as "Jesus of Nazareth...the Holy One of God' [1:22]. Do we recognise Jesus and his God given authority over the powers of evil and sin? Are we ready to ask him to free us from the power of sin and evil?

Are we committed enough to him so as to allow this continual conversion and transformation to occur in our lives? Conversely, as baptised and confirmed members of the Church we too have been commissioned by the same Spirit as Jesus to speak and act with the same authority as Jesus within our world.

This is the mission of every baptised Christian. Pope Francis reminds us of this task when he states that 'The Holy Spirit gives us the courage to proclaim fearlessly what we believe, both with words and with lives lived convincingly' [The Gospel of Joy (2013), n. 259]. Are we ready and willing to be directed in our words and actions by this same Spirit and so to be true prophets in our world of God's message?




