THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD - YEAR B

Acts 1:11

Entrance Antiphon

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.

Dear Friends,

We are familiar with the words of the Prayer of St Francis of Assisi: 'Lord make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred let me bring your love.....' The sentiment of this prayer is reflected in today's liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord. In celebrating the Ascension, we consider the fact that Jesus not only physically departs from his disciples, but that he entrusts them with the continuation of the mission he had begun. From now on they will be his instruments within the world. Jesus' words to his disciples before he takes leave of them emphasise this area of mission: 'Go out into the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation.' [Mark 16:15].

The Ascension of the Lord has traditionally been celebrated as the departure of Jesus from his disciples as he returns to the Father. Rather in celebrating this solemnity we need to remain with the themes taken up by the Scriptures, and realise that it is a passing on of the mission to the disciples to bring to the entire world. It is not an ending but a beginning. It is similar to a relay race. As one runner passes the baton into the hands of the next runner, the original runner disappears, leaving only the present runner, who continues the race, building upon the lead that the preceding runner built. So too, at the Ascension, the Lord passes the baton onto the disciples to begin a worldwide mission of spreading the Good News. Today's gospel passage concludes with this very action: 'they went about preaching everywhere. the Lord working through them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it' [Mark 15:20].

As we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, we need to place ourselves in the picture. Just as Jesus commissioned those first disciples on his departure, so too he commissions us to be his presence with in the world. We are the instruments. We are his voice, his hands, his feet and indeed his whole presence to others. What is required of us is simply to be open to the Spirit his has given to each of us at our Baptism and Confirmation and to continue to have faith and trust in him. As we continue to carry out his mission within the world. there can be a pitfall, where we can get caught up in our successes and failures within the mission. In either circumstance we are not to be deterred or distracted. We should not think of ourselves as great when people respond to our pastoral efforts. So too we must not be discouraged when we find that, pastorally speaking, we are going nowhere. The story of the early Church as portrayed in the Acts of the Apostles, speaks of successes and failures, or hardship and joy. But in all this there is the openness of its members to the presence of the Spirit and the deepening of their faith.

All Jesus asks is that we place our faith in him and give of our best efforts each day to the mission entrusted to us through our Baptism. St Francis de Sales reminds us to begin each day anew, trying to be faithful in allowing Jesus to live in us and love through us. As we contemplate the return of Jesus to the Father, we may think of renewing our faith in all that Jesus has taught us. Relying on this learning, we can approach each day with joy and confidence, remembering that we are the instruments of Jesus in our world and that Jesus is always with us!
