A reading from the first book of Samuel

The Lord has put you in my power, but I will not raise my hand against you.

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David answered Abishai, Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

Lk 6:27-38

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *Be merciful as your Father is merciful* 

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'

Dear Friends,

Today's gospel passage [Luke 6:27-38] has Jesus continuing his teaching the multitude and his disciples. We heard Jesus giving us the Beatitudes containing elements that go against the everyday values of the world. These Beatitudes are a proclamation that seems to laud poverty, hunger, sorrow and hatred and rejection by others who live according to the world's values. They challenge us to regard the foundations of our happiness: in the world's values or those of Christ. Having laid down the groundwork, Jesus now turns to perhaps the most challenging elements of his new order.

The litany of statements that are presented here go to the heart of the Christian message:

- Love your enemies; [v. 27]
- Do good to those who hate you; [v.27]
- Bless those who persecute you; [v.28]
- Pray for those who treat you badly; [v.28]
- Treat others as you would like to be treated yourself [v.31].
- Do good without hope of return [v.35]
- Do not judge or condemn; be ready to forgive [v.37].

The reason for this behaviour is to allow us to be more God-like. Jesus plainly states: "Be compassionate just as your heavenly Father is compassionate" [v. 37]. Our behaviour is not only based on the way God interacts with us, but it has to emulate God's actions. Jesus raises the moral bar to an almost impossible height. What is asked of us as his followers seems to be almost unattainable – beyond human capability. It truly brings to mind the essential nature of being a Christian – our lives need to be counter cultural.

This mentality is given prominence in our first reading [1 Samuel 26:2.7-9,12-13,22-23] which tells of the way in which David spared the life of King Saul. In order to appreciate this passage, we need to go back a little and recognise that Saul had set out to do away with David simply because he became envious and jealous of David's rapid climb in popularity among the people [see 1 Samuel 19:8-11]. The first reading tells us that David showed mercy to Saul: 'Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed" [V. 23].

In a similar way we too need to extend the hand of forgiveness to those who have wronged us. At the very least our relationship with these 'difficult people' should challenge us to pray for them. Mahatma Gandhi [1869 -1948] when asked about Jesus and Christianity made some pertinent remarks: '...it is a first-class tragedy that people who claim to believe the message of Jesus, whom they describe as the Prince of Peace show little of that belief in practice...and Live like Jesus did and the world will listen."

This rings true of the practice of this important Christian teaching, but that is no reason to refrain from trying to live out its ideals. Paul reminds us in the second reading that we are "modelled on the heavenly man" [1 Corinthians 15:49] and as such our behaviour should be like that of Jesus Christ. He had given us this great mandate – to be compassionate as our heavenly Father is compassionate. It is our responsibility to ensure that our words and actions make this a reality.














The 'Lenten Companion 2022' will be available in the church foyer from late next week.
