### **Entrance Antiphon**

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

#### **Second Reading**

Rom 8:8-17

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us

cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

Jesus said to his disciples:

'If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him.

Those who do not love me do not keep my words. And my word is not my own:

it is the word of the one who sent me.

I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.'

Dear Friends,

With today's celebration of Pentecost, we come to the close of the Easter season. It is not only a time for us to remember and recall the beginnings of the Church on that first Pentecost day, but also to engage our minds to appreciate the Holy Spirit and His proper place within the story of our Salvation. We refer to the Spirit each Sunday when we profess our faith with the recitation of the Creed. In the Apostles' Creed two mentions are made of the Spirit. Firstly, that the Spirit was involved in the events of the Annunciation as we proclaim: 'He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit'. Further on we make the statement that 'I believe in the Holy Spirit'. The Nicene Creed also mentions the work of the Holy Spirit at the Annunciation when it states: 'and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.' This Creed further elaborates the mission of the Holy Spirit when it proclaims: 'we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.' Our belief in the presence of the Spirit is one which associates his 'work' and mission as one of empowerment, giving and renewing life and encouraging people to speak the Truth of God's ways.

Our faith tells us that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. We can compare this to the sacrament of Marriage where through the love of husband and wife is born the product of that love – their children. Jesus often mentions in John's Gospel that the Advocate, the Spirit cannot be sent to the disciples unless he returns to the Father. Even though there is that equality between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, often we can refer to the Spirit as the forgotten relative. Much more emphasis seems to be placed on God as Father and Son. However, when we consult the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we find that all is placed in perspective. Part One, Section Two, Chapter 2 [CIC # 683-747] of the Catechism gives us a succinct exposé of the place and working of the Spirit in our lives. It begins by emphasising that without the presence of the Spirit in our lives we cannot proclaim Jesus is Lord – the knowledge of faith is only possible in and with the Holy Spirit (CIC # 683). A careful reading of this section challenges us to see the Spirit not simply as an article of faith proclaimed in our Creed on Sundays, but as an essential co-worker in the mission of the Son. From the very moment of creation when Genesis sates that the Spirit of God hovered over the chaos of the waters, we have frequent references to the work and mission of that same Spirit.

Last Sunday we celebrated the Ascension of the

Lord. Prior to Jesus withdrawing from the sight of the disciples, he tells them that he sent them what was promised by the Father. He instructs them to stay in the city until they are clothed with the power from on high. This is a reference to the descent of the Spirit. It is the final and most challenging part of their formation as they leave the security of the upper room and continue the mission that Jesus entrusted to them — to preach the message of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. This is the same mission entrusted to us.

As the first disciples were changed, transformed and empowered by the Spirit on that first Pentecost day, so too we are challenged to turn to that same Spirit we received at Baptism and Confirmation as a means for us to be true bearers of the message and Truth of the Gospel within our world. 'Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of us your faithful and enkindle in us the fire of your love!'
