A reading from the prophet Isaiah

God himself will come and save us.

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid.

'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Mt 11:2-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

Dear Friends,

This season of Advent is one that calls us to prepare for and to await the coming of Jesus at Christmas. It urges us to ensure that we make a place for God during this time of preparation, so that God remains with us throughout the entire year and not just at Christmas. It can be difficult for us to give time to God in the busyness of our lives and commitments, but it is essential that we do, otherwise our lives and our destinies are indeed at a loss. We can see this in the life of the great prophet John the Baptist. In the Gospels he is introduced as being full of the life of God as he calls the people to conversion and repentance, reminding them that there is One greater who is to come [Matthew 3:1-12]. It is the hope that John places in his God that sustains him throughout his mission, as we see his on the brink of despair as he languishes in prison, but still placing his hopes in Jesus the Promised Messiah.

I would like to share with you an excerpt taken from the Office of Readings for Friday of the First Week of Advent. It is written by **St Anselm of Canterbury (1033-1109)**, a monk, from his work called the **Proslogion**. It becomes a tremendous prayer and challenge for us as we continue in our Advent preparation

...Flee your preoccupations for a little while. Hide yourself for a time from your turbulent thoughts. Cast aside, now, your heavy responsibilities and put off your burdensome business. Make a little space free for God; and rest for a little time in him.

Enter the inner chamber of your mind; shut out all thoughts. Keep only thought of God, and thoughts that can aid you in seeking him. Close your door and seek him. Speak now, my whole heart! Speak now to God, saying, I seek your face; your face, Lord, will I seek.

And come you now, O Lord my God, teach my heart where and how it may seek you, where and how it may find you...I am breathless with desire to see you, and your face is too far from me. I long to come to you, and your dwelling-place is inaccessible. I am eager to find you, but do not know where. I desire to seek you, and do not know your face.

Lord, you are my God, and you are my Lord, and never have I seen you. You have made me and renewed me, you have given me all the good things that I have, and I have not yet met you. I was created to see you, and I have not yet done the thing for which I was made...Look upon us, Lord; hear us, enlighten us, reveal yourself to us. Restore yourself to us, that it may be well with us, yourself, without whom it is so ill with us. Pity our toilings and strivings toward you since we can do nothing without you...Teach me to seek you, and reveal yourself to me when I seek you, for I cannot seek you unless you teach me, nor find you unless you reveal yourself. Let me seek you in longing, let me long for you in seeking; let me find

you by loving you and love you in the act of finding you.

This prayer echoes our desire to recognise and be more aware of God's presence in our lives. In many ways it highlights the plight of the imprisoned John the Baptist, who we encounter in this Sunday's Gospel [Matthew 11:2-11]. John asks his disciples to find out whether this person Jesus of Nazareth is the 'the one who is to come, or have we to wait for someone else' [Matt 11:3]. At times, like John when we experience moments of doubt — the 'distance of God'- we too may question God's presence and intentions. We can take as our motto for this coming week Jesus' reply to John's disciples: 'happy the one who does not lose faith in me' [Matt 11:6]. May God continue to reveal himself to us in this coming week in the events of our lives.

Please note that this day will also be the last novena for 2022. This long-running novena to Our Mother of Perpetual Help will resume on Wednesday 11 January 2023.








