# First Sunday of Lent —Year B

# **Entrance Antiphon**

Cf Psalm 90:15-16

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

# First Reading

**Genesis 9:8-15** 

A reading from the book of Genesis

I will recall the covenant between myself and you... the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh.

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

# Second reading

1 Peter 3:18-22

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

The water of the flood is a type of the baptism which saves you now.

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

## Gospel

Mark 1:12-15

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark *He was tempted by Satan, and the angels looked after him.* 

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him.

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

# Dear Friends,

We have embarked on our Lenten journey once again. The first two Sundays of Lent are dedicated to the **Temptation** of Christ (1<sup>st</sup> Sunday) in the desert and the **Transfiguration** (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday). In many ways it seems fitting that we should have the Gospel which depicts Jesus' time in the desert, since this period of Lent calls us to move into our own particular places of solitude in order for us to confront our demons and temptations, and to be nourished by God's presence.

This year we have the shortest of the accounts of Jesus' temptation in the desert [Mark 1:12-13]. In two short verses, Mark tells us the very fundamentals of this episode in Jesus' life:

- Jesus is driven into the desert by the Spirit
- He remains there for forty days
- While in the desert, Jesus is tempted by the Devil (Satan)
- Jesus was in the desert with the wild beasts (the implication being that they did not harm him)
- Angels tended to him during this period.

Just prior to this episode we hear of Jesus being baptised in the Jordan by John, and that during this baptism the Spirit of God descended on him in the form of a dove [Mark 1: 10]. It is this same Spirit that drives him into the desert, so we can fathom that this period in the wilderness will not necessarily be a negative experience for Jesus – the Spirit as the animator of this movement will also be the guide and protector of Jesus.

Mark does not go into any length in describing the content of Satan's temptations of Jesus. We receive a fuller account of this in the other two **Synoptic Gospels** – **Matthew 4:1-11** and **Luke 4:1-13**. We can be certain that the main aim of Satan's presence during Jesus' desert experience is to tempt him away from his primary goal – the announcement and establishment of the Kingdom of God, for if this goes ahead it will certainly mean the demise of Satan's kingdom.

We need to recognise that temptations are part and parcel of who we are as human beings. The author of the Book of Genesis tells us that sin becomes part of our story through the temptation given to Adam and Eve by the Devil – to eat of the tree of the knowledge of Good and Evil, so that they may be like God. In recognising the place that temptation plays in our lives, we need to also believe that as great and as prevalent these temptations can be, they are not sin. They may cause us to sin, especially if we dwell on them (sometimes referred to as 'entertaining' our temptations) but in themselves they are not sinful. Many of us can feel an amount of guilt and shame when temptations come our way. We need to remember that the great saints were tempted many times in their lives. In fact, the closer we are to God, the more Satan tries to tempt us away from pursuing our spiritual goals – to have us move away from God. In all this our movement into our own personal deserts or places of solitude this Lent becomes a time for us to recognise the factors that bring these temptations about: anger, frustration, low self-esteem, jealousy, envy, greed and the like. Through the grace of God we can then deal with these temptations when they come our way, if we know and are aware of the **conditions** that bring them to us. Our Ash Wednesday liturgy gave us three ways in which we can confront and overcome temptation: fasting, prayer and alms giving. May we keep these three elements in mind as we begin this Lenten journey into our own private 'deserts' that God will be with us, sustaining us and urging us to remain in the desert for the full period of Lent, so that we may emerge from that experience renewed and strengthened in our resolve to move from the desert into the world with the same message that Jesus announced: "Repent, and believe in the Good News, for the Kingdom of God is close at hand."


